WHY SHOULD TRIBES BE INVOLVED ?

Forest Service National Planning Rule Revision

The National Planning Rule is **THE framework for all National Forest Management Plans**. The revision will direct how hundreds of forest land management plans, covering many ancestral forests where Tribes retain treaty rights, trust resources, and ancestral rights, will be developed.

This One Rule Affects:

- **Priorities and Issues** to be addressed in National Forest Management Plans.
- **Procedural guidelines for implementing priorities** (e.g., consulting and collaborating with Tribes on their rights and interests, consistency with Tribal Land management plans.

All national Forest Plans are subject to the National Planning Rule and the scope and priorities it identifies. The Planning Rule and subsequent land management plans have implications for how common watersheds, over 2100 miles of shared boundaries between tribal and national forest lands, and the ancestral lands currently managed by the Forest Service will be managed in the future.
